

Bruno Mortaigne was a graduate from the University Pierre et Marie Curie (Paris VI) of Paris and received a master degree in chemistry (physico chemical analysis by mass spectrometry). He received his material and structure PhD in 1988, from Ecole Nationale Supérieure d'Arts et Métiers, in PIMM (Procédés et Ingénierie en Matériaux et Mécaniques) laboratory.

His scientific research was on polymer durability and applications, and he has published more than 100 papers.

He was awarded "ordre des palmes académiques", by the French Ministry of Research and National Education.

In 2000, he worked as a technical expert on organic material for aeronautic structures in DGA. In 2005, he obtained a position of head of material department as senior expert. Since 2010, Bruno Mortaigne joined the DGA strategy directorate, as head of "material, chemistry and energy" scientific domain. Currently, the main focus of his work is to coordinate scientific activities, to cooperate with other ministry and agency, to identify and promote the key technological capability and develop cooperation projects between industry and university to answer DGA technical needs.
